ABOUT THE LIBRARY

Dedicated in 1898, the Old Lyme–Phoebe Griffin Noyes Library is a private, independent 501(c)(3) charitable organization. It is owned by the Old Lyme-Phoebe Griffin Noyes Library Association, Inc., and governed by its Board of Trustees. The day-to-day operations of the Library are managed by the Library director and 11 staff (total FTE 8.5).

As the Town of Old Lyme's designated public library, the Old Lyme-Phoebe Griffin Noyes Library receives some funding from the municipality (44% of budgeted FY23-24 income). This municipal funding combines with income from the Association's Endowment, the proceeds of the Library's annual fund drive, income from the Friends of the Library, and various grants to fund the Library's annual operating budget. The Library is a long-standing member of the Libraries Online, Inc. Consortium (LION).

From developing fun, interactive story times for infants and toddlers to hand-delivering books to homebound patrons, the Library continues to provide opportunities for residents of all ages to learn and grow. Our core services include providing access to a variety of print and digital books, audio-visual media, and research tools; assisting with technology and encouraging the development of information literacy; supporting the public school curriculum; conducting early literacy training and fostering an enduring interest in learning and reading among our youngest patrons; and offering programming that informs and engages the community.

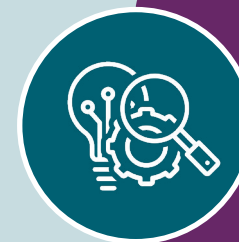

STORYWALK®

In late June, the Library, in partnership with the Roger Tory Peterson Estuary Center, celebrated the opening of a new StoryWalk®. The StoryWalk® promotes early literacy, physical activity, and family time together in nature and is dedicated in memory of Agnes O'Connor, a beloved Old Lyme resident and volunteer who loved reading and nature.



2ND ANNUAL MINI GOLF CELEBRATION!

In February 2024, the Library hosted its 2nd Annual Mini Golf Event! Members of the community were invited to gather at the Library for a day of play and festivities. Over 250 community members joined in on the fun made possible by the generous support of 20 local businesses.



OLD LYME WITNESS STONES

The Library is honored to continue to participate in this partnership tasked with commemorating the lives of enslaved persons in historic Lyme-Old Lyme. In late May, the Library hosted the 4th Annual Installation Ceremony for community members and partners. 10 new plaques were installed for a total of 48 placed in the Old Lyme & Lyme communities to date.

GALLERY WALL

In August 2023, the Library unveiled a new exhibit space for temporary art shows featuring the work of local artists and organizations. The 2023-2024 year featured art from individual artists Tony Donovan, Fred Verillo, Eddie Lopez, and Norma DeGrafft plus community shows from the Lyme Art Association, the Senior Center, and a Library photography workshop.



LYME-OLD LYME SCHOOLS

Children's Librarian Meg and YA Librarian Nike continued to strengthen the Library's partnership with the local schools. 2023-2024 items of note include: Monthly Pre-School Visits, Annual Mile Creek Pep Rally in advance of the summer, 7th Grade Year-End Class Visits, and the amazing Annual Bookies Awards.

BUILDING ACCESS



NEW ONLINE RESOURCES

The Library began offering two new digital resources—Hiveclass, an online collection of Phys Ed courses and activities, and Heritage Quest, an online genealogy research database.



IMPROVING TECHNOLOGY

The Library installed a new, up-to-date computer and printing management system. This new system allows for fair use in the event of a wait and ensures all patrons are treated equitably in relation to paying to use the printer.



UPDATING ADULT NONFICTION

Work on a multi-year project to improve the quality and currency of the adult nonfiction collections began.

DISCOVER & EXPLORE

There's always something to explore in the Children's Room! From great books to interesting activities, 2023–2024 highlights include *Hatch the Chickens!* in October—patrons were able to track the hatching and early development of live chicks over a 5 week period—and the roll out of monthly *Scavenger Hunts* in the spring.

GATHER TOGETHER & LEARN

Regular story times provide opportunities for our youngest patrons to develop early literacy skills and socialize. *Wee Readers* met weekly on Thursday mornings throughout the year, and a new weekly *PJ Family Story Time* was added to the rotation in the spring. Special events like the LEGO® Robotics & Cool-ology STEAM Workshops provide additional opportunities to learn and connect.



HANDS-ON CREATIVITY

Children are invited to explore their creative side when visiting the Library. Hands-on crafts are available throughout the year, and all creations are proudly displayed in the Children's Room each month. Plus, special events, like *Build a Leprechaun Trap*, art studio with *Shell & Bee*, and regular family LEGO® building days provided chances to create something new while having fun and learning.

Teen Services

TEEN ADVISORY BOARD (TAB)

This group, established in early 2023, provides opportunities for those in grades 10+ to work creatively with their peers. The group brainstorms improvements to Library offerings, implements programs collectively, works on self-directed projects, and mentors younger volunteers. Highlights of the year include:



LOLHS SENIOR PROJECT

Long time volunteer Stella chose to focus her Senior Project on the Library! Not only did she organize the YA Zine Library, she developed *Books & Banter*, a books and media centered discussion group for teens with hands-on creative opportunities.

ITALIAN CONVERSATION GROUP

Senior Giovanna planned, developed, and hosted a series of programs for patrons of all ages to learn conversational Italian! The three sessions were immensely popular, with nearly 20 regular participants.

HOMEWORK HELPERS

High School Teens provided weekly homework help to younger patrons after school.

In late 2023, the Library began hosting a monthly D&D group for teens. This new offering was a huge success!

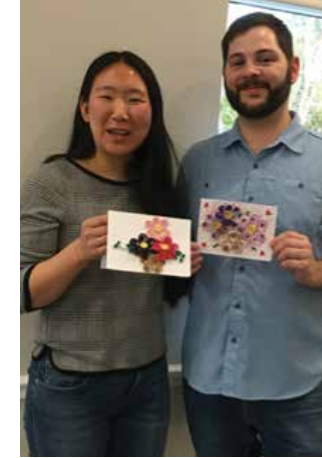
HAUNTED BOO-k CELLAR

HANDS-ON LEARNING & FUN

Creative workshops for adults to develop a new hands-on skill or just have fun were offered seasonally. Opportunities included: Fall Flower Arranging, Spring Loop-yarn Wreath Making, Mother's Day Card Paper Quilling, & iPhone Photography

Plus, the Library distributed 2,000 free solar eclipse glasses in advance of the April 8, 2024 eclipse!

MAKING CONNECTIONS

The Library continues to develop small group opportunities for community members to meet and get to know one another—both to foster connection and to broaden perspectives and understanding.

This year, we rolled out 2 new groups for adults. These new groups complement our already well-established book groups, *Contemporary Classics Book Discussion* and *Phoebe's Morning Book Chat*.

FARAWAY FICTION BOOK CHAT

Embark on a new adventure with each book! This new group features a book chat for lovers of Sci-Fi and Fantasy.

DARK NONFICTION BOOK CLUB

This new book club is designed for the morbidly curious. Participants explore dark topics such as true crime, natural disasters, war stories, death and dying, man-made disasters, forensic science, burial and funerary practices, and cults.

We focused on maintaining our infrastructure and planning for a near-future roofing project.

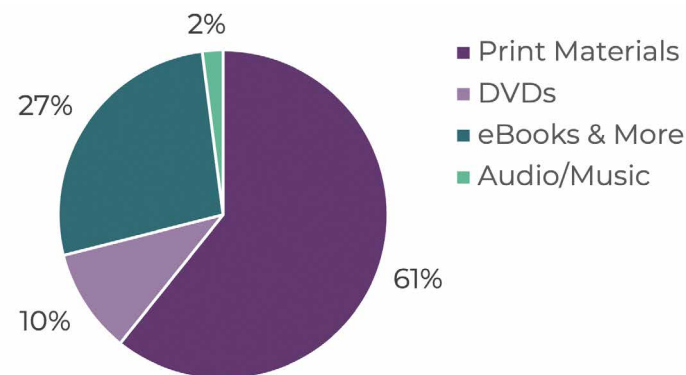
OUR COLLECTIONS & SERVICES

The Library's Collections contain 38,000+ physical items and 29,000+ digital items. In addition, our membership in Libraries Online, Inc. (LION) grants patrons access to over 2 million physical titles across the region. LION delivered nearly 6,000 items to Old Lyme patrons for local use this year.

USE OF COLLECTIONS

Over 72,000 items were checked out by patrons.

Nearly 3,500 residents have active library cards plus an additional 300 out-of-town patrons. The Library issued over 500 new cards in 2023–2024.



The Library's 8 public computers were used 2,365 times for a total of 4,236 hours of use.



Library staff assisted patrons 2,345 times with research assistance and hands-on technology help. Staff placed nearly 3,000 holds for patrons.



The Library's three study rooms were booked 2,076 times, and local groups gathered in the community room for meetings 125 times.

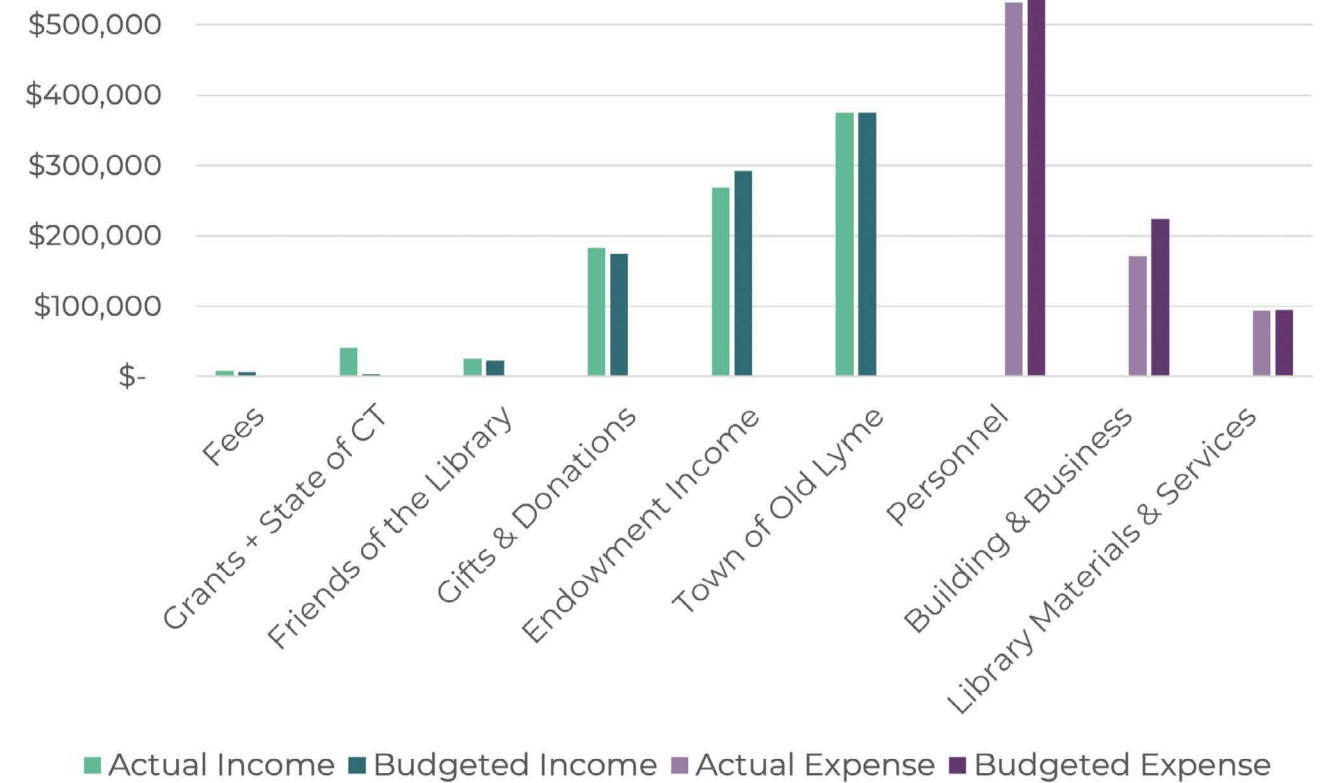

OPERATING INCOME & EXPENSES 2023–2024: BUDGETED VS. ACTUAL



ENDOWED FUNDS REPORT

The Library Endowment was established in 1899 with \$10,000 in gifts from the Ludington & Noyes families. Over the next 125 years, additional funds were contributed by Old Lyme residents committed to supporting the long-term success of the Library. Today, the funds comprise a variety of investments; some are restricted funds, designated to be spent on particular categories of books, materials, & services, while some are unrestricted and are used to cover a portion of annual personnel and building expenses.

For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, withdrawals from the Endowment represented 30% of the Library's total operating actual income. Contributions from the Town of Old Lyme accounted for 44% of the actual operating income and donations and gifts represented 22%. During the fiscal year, the Endowment investments portfolio returned 15.49%.

This new (and popular!) weekly series featured a picture book story time followed by a hands-on art project inspired by the artists' work.

Summer 2024 featured our first successful adult summer reading program with over 50 adults joining in on the fun! Participants submitted 38 book reviews and earned 74 raffle tickets toward these amazing prizes: Kindle, portable phone charger, hiking poles and CT hikes book, tabletop s'mores maker, gourmet popcorn kit, margarita making kit, CT cutting board, & a camping hammock.

FOR TEENS

VISITING ARTISTS

Hands-on summer activities for teens were made possible by support from the Lymes Creative Arts & the Katharine Forest Crafts Foundation. Artists lead leather working, sewing, and ceramics making workshops. Teens also met weekly for a Summer Stitch Club.

SUMMER CHALLENGE!

51 teens participated in this year's reading and activity challenge!

Back by popular demand, the teens hosted their annual custom screen printing booth at the Midsummer Festival. An open call for design submissions went out in early summer.
